

Author Guidelines for National Seminar on “Management, Commerce and Economics- 2017”

(Emerging Trends in Business & Economic Development in India with reference to North-Eastern Region)

1. Original Research work will only be accepted. The papers submitted will be reviewed by a group of experts.
2. The manuscript should be in MS Word 2007 format. Manuscript must be 1.5 spaced, with 1 inch margins with "Times New Roman, Font size 12, black".
3. In the first page of the paper please provide Paper Title, full name of the author(s) and full addresses (institute's address along with designation and corresponding address) along with the email address of the author (s).
4. The abstract, followed by relevant keywords, should not be more than 250 words and should adequately describe the work and highlight its significance.
5. The complete manuscript should be in the range of 4000-6000 words.
6. All correspondence will be done through e-mail only.
7. Suggestive framework of the paper: Introduction, statement of the problem, literature review, Objectives, Hypothesis/Research Questions, Research Methodology, Analysis and Findings, Conclusion and Recommendation (if any).
8. A declaration of Originality has to be submitted by the author(s) in prescribed format which will be sent to all accepted authors of accepted papers.
9. The authors must follow the APA 6th Edition style for referencing as presented below:

Journal paper:

Template:

Author, A. A., Author, B. B., & Author, C. C. (Year). Title of article. *Title of Periodical*, volume number (issue number), pages.

Example:

Scruton, R. (1996). The eclipse of listening. *The New Criterion*, 15(3), 5-13.

Book:

Template:

Author, A. A. (Year of publication). *Title of work: Capital letter also for subtitle*. Location: Publisher.

Example:

Calfee, R. C., & Valencia, R. R. (1991). *APA guide to preparing manuscripts for journal publication*. Washington, DC: American Psychological Association.

Article /chapter in Edited Book:

Template:

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Year of publication). Title of chapter. In A. A. Editor & B. B. Editor (Eds.), *Title of book* (pages of chapter). Location: Publisher.

Example:

O'Neil, J. M., & Egan, J. (1992). Men's and women's gender role journeys: A metaphor for healing, transition, and transformation. In B. R. Wainrib (Ed.), *Gender issues across the life cycle* (pp. 107-123). New York, NY: Springer.

Article from an Online Periodical:

Template:

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Date of publication). Title of article. *Title of Online Periodical*, volume number(issue number if available). Retrieved from
